Identify trees in the winter at Forest Preserve program

GENEVA, IL — Learn to identify trees in the winter, during a “Learn from the Experts” nature program, Jan. 27.

During “Winter Tree Identification,” Saturday, Jan. 27, from 1-3 p.m., you’ll learn the basics of tree identification (without leaves) and gain experience using a botanical key.

Forest Preserve District of Kane County Nature Programs Manager Valerie Blaine will share tips to help de-mystify winter tree identification and will emphasize observation of bark, branches, form, habit, habitat, twigs, leaf scars and buds.

The session will begin indoors with a presentation. During the second hour, we’ll head into the woods to practice tree-identification skills.
